Criteria to consider when nominating a Life Member of the Association

- 1. This award is from the Association. The individual that you nominate should have an active status and have done something of benefit for the Association as a whole. Some examples would be: consistently bringing new members into their club therefore growing the organization, setting up a membership drive for the organization, serving on the Board, chairing a convention and so on.**
- 2. If you have a member that you feel goes above and beyond, but does not fit into this criteria, consider nominating them for an Honorary membership in your club.**
- 3. Do not nominate more than one life member in a year per club.**
- 4. You can nominate the same person each year until they receive a Life Membership. There is a maximum of one Life Membership a year awarded by the AOWC, and it may take several years before your nominee is honored with this award. That does not necessarily mean that they do not qualify or that they are not a great choice. It just means that the Board may have received many equally worthy nominations.**
- 5. You cannot nominate a current Board member. The Board selects the life member from the nominees and it would be very difficult and even embarrassing to have to vote on someone who is part of the process.**
